HERITAGE ELEMENTARY- GRADES K-2

Jump Start Kindergarten

Preparing your child for a successful kindergarten year

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Jumpstart Kindergarten will be an opportunity for your child to become familiar with Kindergarten and Heritage Elementary. We will focus on colors, numbers, shapes and writing our name the "Kindergarten Way." Your child will have the opportunity to work on their social skills, listening skills and interact with fun stories.

Imagination Station- First Grade

Have you ever wondered what it would be like to have wings? We are going to learn all about aerodynamics and what makes things fly well. We will even create our own flying machines and test how they fly!

Have you ever had a problem that you couldn't fix? Have you had an idea for something that hasn't been invented yet? Here is your chance to invent something that will make life better!

Ever wonder what it would be like to be in charge of keeping the world safe? We are going to shake, rattle, and roll as we create our own earthquake shelter!

This year in our summer school classroom we will do all of this and more? We will be creating, collaborating, and testing ideas through a series of interactive projects and research. We will spend time collecting data, testing our ideas and using technology to lead us to our conclusions.

MIDDLE SCHOOL 6-8

Below you will find a list of the classes offered at the Middle School during summer session. During summer school, students will experience a rotation of the classes offered below. On the registration form, please indicate your student's transportation plans, as transportation will be limited.

6th Grade Boot Camp

Teacher: TBD

This class is designed to help incoming 6th graders get a head start on life as a middle school student at OMS. Through a variety of math, reading, and STEM activities students will begin to unlock the keys to success in 6th grade. They will then have the opportunity to create their own challenges to assist their classmates who will be joining them in the fall.

Math Enrichment/Credit Recovery

Teacher: Mrs. Jones

This summer school math enrichment/credit recovery class will be provided to help students continue to grow their math skills through a variety of lessons and activities that are appropriate to the student's current level.

ELA enrichment/Credit Recovery

Teacher: Mrs. Bradley

This summer school ELA enrichment/credit recovery class will be provided to help students continue to grow their English Language Arts (with an emphasis on reading) skills through a variety of lessons and activities that are appropriate to the student's current level.

Summer Science: Conservation

Teacher: Mrs. Brenda Thompson

This summer we will be learning about conservation. Being from the beautiful Lake of the Ozarks, most of us are familiar with the term conservation, but what does it really mean? We often think of conservation as preservation of an area for wildlife. And while that is true, in science conservation can have multiple meanings. Over the next few weeks we will learn how the Law of Conservation of Energy and the Law of Conservation of Matter go hand in hand with biological Conservation. What we have is what we get! How can it be altered? Restored? Destroyed? Created?

Lifetime Sports

Teacher: Mr. Volkart

This class is designed to improve your fitness and allow you to experience and gain skills playing sports that you can enjoy throughout your lifetime. Each week will focus on a different sport and will include research into history, rules, and legends of each game and may include field trips. There will also be an emphasis on maintaining a healthy lifestyle that can be accentuated by playing these sports.

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Below you will find a list of the classes offered at the High School during Summer 2 School. There are several options- online courses for credit, in-person credit recovery, special opportunities that are not for credit.

ONLINE Personal Finance (required graduation credit, 0.5 practical art credit)- Mrs. White

Must be taken with Career Mentor course.

This course will be offered ONLINE ONLY. Students will be issued their school device through the month of June to complete coursework. Students may choose to work from home, but are welcome to come to the high school during summer school hours to have free Internet access. Students enrolled in an online summer course will be required to attend a summer school orientation meeting on Tuesday, May 28th, 10:00am-12:00pm. This instructional program prepares individuals to understand the unique dimensions of one's own personal finances. It includes instruction in financial goal setting and strategies, household income and money management, including spending, credit, saving and investing. This class would be open to students grades 9-12. 30 seats are available.

ONLINE Health (required graduation credit, 0.5 required credit)- Mr. Baumstark

Must be taken with Speech course.

This course will be offered ONLINE ONLY. Students will be issued their school device through the month of June to complete coursework. Students may choose to work from home, but are welcome to come to the high school during summer school hours to have free Internet access. Students enrolled in an online summer course will be required to attend a summer school orientation meeting on Tuesday, May 28th, 10:00am-12:00pm. This course includes the following subject areas: personality and emotions, medical care and preventative medicine, biological systems of the body, nutrition, diet and weight control, physical fitness, infectious diseases, tobacco, drugs and alcohol, and CPR. This course is open to students grades 9-12 (upperclassmen given priority). 30 seats are available.

ONLINE Speech (.5 credit-meets the required Speech credit for graduation) - Mrs. Hinshaw

Must be taken with Health course.

Summer School Speech is an online class. If you have ever been afraid of speaking in public, you should take this class. You will learn strategies that address fear of public speaking and how to be a better communicator! We will learn how to work with peers to promote civil discussions and decision-making! This will meet your Speech requirement for graduation!!!

ONLINE Career Mentor: (.5 credit-meets the required Career Mentor credit for graduation)- Mr. Happel

Must be taken with Personal Finance course.

Summer School Career Mentor meets the graduation credit for Career Mentor in a much shorter time. We will learn how to build on your own strengths and utilize others strengths to maintain positive relationships. We will perfect resumes and get you ready for future interviews as well as set up a solid plan for after graduation!

Credit Recovery Courses- Mrs. Rowland

Credit recovery courses required for graduation in the four core areas are offered through Odysseyware, an online learning system. A student may take up to TWO credit recovery courses during summer school (recovering a total of 1 credit toward graduation or to recover credits toward regaining MSHSAA eligibility). Credit recovery for non-core classes requires administration approval. 50 seats are available.

Regaining MSHSAA Eligibility through Credit Recovery

For students attending summer school credit recovery in order to regain eligibility, MSHSAA sets for the following:

Grades 9-12 Summer School: Secondary school-sponsored summer courses may count toward maintaining senior high academic eligibility for the FALL semester providing the following requirements are met:

- 1. The counting of secondary school-sponsored summer school credits must first be approved by the local school administration.
- 2. Credit earned for the summer school course is placed on the student's school transcript and counts towards graduation.
- 3. The course must be a class identified by the local school board/governing body as required for graduation/promotion requirements.
- 4. Electives taken in any of the four core content areas (language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies) may be counted toward this requirement of academic eligibility.
- 5. Correspondence/online courses may not count as summer school credit, unless they meet the requirements of By-Law 2.3.4c.
- 6. A MoVIP course may count toward fall eligibility if the course taken meets the requirements of this section and is completed on or before July 31.
- 7. No more than one credit earned in summer school shall count toward maintaining academic eligibility.

Driver's Education (NO high school credit)

30 hours of classroom time WHICH WILL BE DONE ONLINE via CANVAS & 18 hours of observation and driving time. Although this class is transcribed on the student's permanent record, NO HS credit will be given). Designed to promote a positive attitude toward safety, this course helps students become well-informed, safe drivers. Lessons and activities focus on driving laws, the driving task, car controls, defensive driving maneuvers, negotiating intersections, and car control. Students will explore driving strategies for city traffic, rural roads, and highways, during bad weather, and handling emergencies. They will also examine how alcohol and other drugs can affect their driving, as well as the hazards involved with driving distractions, such as cell phone use. Certificate will be issued upon completion. 18 seats are available. The high school administration holds the right to deny an applicant due to attendance, grades or discipline. Ms. Brunnert will notify applicants of their standing.

Requirements:

- Students must be enrolled in the Osage school district and have attended the 2022-2023 school year.
 - Priority enrollment will be given to students who have maintained 90% attendance, and at least a 2.5 GPA during the 2022-2023 school year.
- Students must be at least 15 years old prior to the beginning of the driving and observation portion.
- Students must complete all assessments at a minimum of 80% of the possible points for the class.
- Students must meet all skill objectives at a minimum level of 70% for the class.
- Students who fail to complete the Online Canvas class with an 80%, prior to the start of driving sessions, will be removed from the driving and observation schedule and dropped from the course.
- School of the Osage School District is obligated by the Department of Education to meet minimum standards for a Driver's Education program; therefore, there are no exceptions to the requirements.

Lifetime Sports (co-ed) (0.5 credit—meets part of 1.0 physical education graduation requirement)-

This course applies the principles, practices and the importance of lifelong individual fitness. Students will participate in a variety of high intensity aerobic fitness workouts and participate in individual fitness evaluations to determine individual fitness goals and progress. In addition, students will have the knowledge of various exercises that can be used to maintain healthy living. In addition, students will learn the history, skills and rules of various competitive sports and games. This course is open to students grades 9-12 (upperclassmen given priority). 30 seats are available. MUST HAVE 15 STUDENTS TO MAKE THE CLASS HAPPEN!!

Weights- (co-ed) (0.5 credit—meets part of 1.0 physical education graduation requirement)

This class will meet from 8:00-12:00 on scheduled summer school days.

Our days will be broken down into segments with appropriate amounts of recovery time for hydration and nutritional purposes. MUST HAVE 15 STUDENTS TO MAKE THE CLASS HAPPEN!!

We will focus on 5 pillars of physical education including:

- Intro to Strength Training
- Cardiovascular Training
- Mobility and Flexibility Training
- Games for Physical Fitness
- Nutrition Education

ACT Bootcamp- (NO High School Credit)-- Students will receive instruction for each subtest, take a practice test and get scores, learn test-taking strategies, and learn how to set score goals and achieve them! This class only holds 20 students and you must be able to take the ACT on Saturday, June 8th to participate.The first 15 students to sign up will test for free. We will enroll you and pay for the ACT Test on that day. The meeting dates and times are: June 3rd through June 7th, from 8:00-12:00.
